DESCRIPTION	This BIP course is the evolution of the previous one, called "ExperTour", that was held in Italy at the Department of Economics of the University of Foggia in the a.y. 2023-2024 ((https://www.economia.unifg.it/it/internazionale/didattica-lingua-straniera).  The aim is to equip participants with the skills to design and implement sustainable, innovative tourism initiatives. Through experiential learning, eco-friendly practices, and technology, it explores challenges and opportunities in creating meaningful travel experiences. Using case studies and hands-on projects, participants will develop expertise in aligning tourism with global sustainability goals, fostering cultural engagement, and supporting community-driven approaches. This course empowers professionals, policymakers, and entrepreneurs to lead the future of sustainable tourism.
